Pre-Loved Perfection: Tips for Buying Secondhand Baby Carriers

Why buy secondhand?

Baby-ready: Woven wraps, soft structured carriers, and other carriers can be stiff right out of the box, but with secondhand carriers, they've usually been softened with use.



Eco-Friendly: By choosing pre-loved carriers, you're keeping perfectly usable products out of landfills.



Budget-Friendly: Quality carriers can be pricey, but buying secondhand allows you to access top-tier brands at a fraction of the price.



Multiple carriers: The secondhand market makes owning multiple carriers more feasible which means each caregiver can have a favorite carrier that they feel confident using with no need to compromise their comfort.



Where to shop:

- Babywearing-Specific Facebook Buy, Sell, Trade (BST)
 Groups + Marketplace
- Local Babywearing + Parenting Groups
- Thrift Stores & Baby-Specific Resale Shops
- Auction Websites like Mercari, Poshmark, eBay
- **Rebelstork** vetted pre-loved or open-box baby gear
- Craigslist



Keep in mind:

When in doubt, reach out to your local babywearing educator and consultant.


- **Buckles and Clips**: These should snap securely and not feel loose or wobbly.
- **Elastic and Webbing**: Elastic parts should still stretch well and not feel brittle. Webbing should be free from frays and glide smoothly when adjusted.
- Fabric: Look for thinning, rips, or fading in weight-bearing areas, such as straps or the main panel.
- **Stitching**: Check for loose or frayed stitching in high-stress areas like the waistband or shoulder straps.
- **Storage and Laundering**: Ask the seller how the carrier was stored and laundered. Carriers stored in damp or extreme heat or washed with harsh detergents may have weakened over time.

Fake or Fabulous? Your Guide to Spotting Counterfeit Baby Carriers

Beware counterfeits and scams! Look out for these red flags:



Suspicious Prices: If a carrier is listed at an unrealistically low price, it's likely a fake.

Logos and Tags: Fakes often have logos or tags that are slightly off, or are missing standard safety warning labels. Examine the details closely.

Photos: Be wary of stock or stolen images. Request real, detailed photos or videos of the carrier from the seller.

Authorized Resellers: Check the brand's website or ask your local babywearing consultant whether the seller is an authorized reseller. This extra step can protect you from purchasing a knockoff.

Check Seller Reviews and Group Rules: Review seller feedback, search their name in the group, and follow any rules set by BST groups or platforms.

Secure Payments:

PayPal Goods & Services: This is generally the safest payment method, as it provides buyer protection. If the seller insists on PayPal Friends & Family, Venmo, or CashApp, consider this a red flag.
